### KILPATRICK TOWNSEND & STOCKTON

Pro bono work often falls to litigators, but 63 lawyers at Kilpatrick Townsend & Stockton dedicated their patent prosecution skills to low-income inventors such as Camille Alleyne, creator of Taza Trays. Alleyne and her family moved to Atlanta from New Jersey three months before Hurricane Sandy damaged their old house. Feeling they were spared for a reason, the family was inspired to become entrepreneurs, developing serving trays with holders designed to prevent beverages from spilling or falling over. “The Taza Tray will not only change the restaurant industry but it will open the door for future female inventors,” Alleyne says.
